Built in the 1940s, The Green Room Hotel just recently underwent a modernization this summer that breathed new life into its walls and transformed it into a bungalow-style boutique hotel. Each room features custom art from local artists, found pieces of mid-century modern furnishings, unique Moroccan rugs, and more. Some units also feature kitchenettes with playful accents like retro-style appliances and private patios with outdoor seating. Elevated amenities include a cedar-style hot tub next to a fire pit and outdoor social area with communal picnic tables for post-surfing socializing and relaxation.
